Faye	Scott, I brought you in this room because I noticed when I was giving your injection, you seem a little bit agitated and I just thought we could have a bit of a chat about that.
[DOOR SLAMS]	
<b>Scott</b>	It's just the door slamming.
[SCOTT CLEARS THROAT]	
<b>Scott</b>	Fuck off. Fuck off.
Faye	So I'm bothering you, Scott?
<b>Scott</b>	Nah. No no, I'm good. I'm good.
[RAPPING ON TABLE]	
<b>Scott</b>	I'm good.
Faye	Remember a couple of weeks ago when you came in and you were quite relaxed and you were comfortable--
<b>Scott</b>	I'm good. I'm good. I'm relaxed now. I'm good.
Faye	Yeah. Because I can see that you're a bit agitated--
<b>Scott</b>	No, nah, I'm fine. I'm good.
Faye	I've been seeing you for a while now, Scott, and it's just your discharge summary. I'm just having a look at maybe some warning signs that you're becoming unwell.
<b>Scott</b>	Nah. I'm good. Good.
Faye	So you're not feeling angry at all?
<b>Scott</b>	Hmm, me? Nah. Nah, I told you, nah!
[RAPPING ON TABLE]	
<b>Scott</b>	Cool. Good. Good.
Faye	OK. You been sleeping, Scott?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah.
Faye	Getting some nice sleep?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah.
Faye	Yeah?
<b>Scott</b>	Yep.

Faye	How many hours did you get last night?
<b>Scott</b>	Three or four.
Faye	Three or four? OK. What woke you up?
[SCOTT SCOFFS]	
<b>Scott</b>	Ever lived in Redford? Three hours is good. Fucking idiots upstairs and the fucking sirens, coppers everywhere. They don't leave you alone. Never leave you alone.
[KNOCKING ON TABLE]	
<b>Scott</b>	What do you got in there, what are you doing, what do you-- fuck off. Fucking coppers.
Faye	So police have been knocking on your door?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah. They don't leave you alone. Once they know you do one thing, one thing, one thing, in your life, one-- never leave you alone. Never. Bastards. Get over there, get over there, I'm fucking-- I'm feeling you up, I'm coming for you. I don't carry shit, I don't. Like what am I, a dealer? What am I, one of these bloody scum drug dealers? Get over against the wall. Pat pat pat. In my business. Fucking coppers.
Faye	OK. So what were they knocking on your door for this time?
<b>Scott</b>	I don't know. I don't know. Looking for someone. Said he was staying at my place. No one's staying at my place. I don't let anyone stay at my place. You get people staying at your place, get into trouble. Department of Housing, they don't like it. People lose their places. You could lose your place. They don't like it. They come around anyway.
Faye	So who do they think was there, then? That dealer that you used to hang around with?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah. I think he's, well I haven't seen him. I I told them look, I haven't seen him. I don't know him. I haven't seen him. He's out of my life. I don't want to know him.
Faye	Because remember before, he used to give you the meth and it used to make you quite unwell?
<b>Scott</b>	Don't fucking go on about that. I smoked it a little bit. I told you that before. I smoked a little bit. I'm not a junkie. Look, look. That was at the doctor's. That was here. That was last week here. A blood test.
Faye	I believe you. Have you taken anything in the last couple of weeks?
<b>Scott</b>	No.
[SCOTT MUMBLING]	
Faye	I know you've had a lot of stress on. Sometimes you used to take drugs to cope with that stress.
<b>Scott</b>	Hmm, yeah, sometimes. Yeah, in the past yeah sometimes.

Faye	Has it happened recently in the last couple of weeks--
<b>Scott</b>	OK, all right, OK. I had a bit of a smoke the other day. I've had a couple of smokes. You happy now? Had a couple of smokes with a mate, that's all.
Faye	OK. I'm not the police. I'm your care coordinator. But I do know that when you do a bit of smoking, it does make you worse sometimes.
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, well, I'm all right. It didn't make me worse. It doesn't do anything. It doesn't do anything. It smooths me out, all right? It smooths me out. That's what me mates said. The mates said hey, come on, chill. Chill. He said a little smoke, beauty. Good. It's good. It's good for you. You people don't know. You don't know, right? You think you know. You don't know.
Faye	OK. Are you worried about anything or anybody?
<b>Scott</b>	No, no. People leave me alone, I'm fine. If people leave me alone, I'm fine.
Faye	Feel safe at the minute, Scott?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, safe, yeah, yeah. Fuck. Fuck. Fuck!
Faye	Can you hear something, Scott? That maybe I couldn't hear?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, maybe, yeah. Yeah.
Faye	What are they saying?
<b>Scott</b>	No, don't worry about that. Don't worry about it.
Faye	I know you find them distressful. You've told me before.
<b>Scott</b>	They tell me I'm a fucking paedophile! I'm not a paedophile. That's what it says. That's what they tell me. That's what they call me.
Faye	Yeah. How long has that been happening for, Scott?
<b>Scott</b>	Oh, fucking years.
Faye	Recently?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, yeah. Worse, yeah. Always there. Always there. But usually, it's not too bad, it's not too loud. I can handle it. I can ignore it.
Faye	Did you have the smoke to deal with the voices?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah.
Faye	It must be awful to hear that.
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah. Yeah, it's fucking awful. Fuck.
Faye	Are they saying anything else, Scott? Are they asking you to do anything?
<b>Scott</b>	No, no, no.

Faye	OK. They're just saying horrible things?
[SCOTT LAUGHS]	
Faye	OK.
<b>Scott</b>	What do you keep looking at that for?
Faye	That's just your discharge summary from last time.
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, why don't you just shut it? You keep looking at it. You keep touching it. Why don't you shut it?
Faye	OK.
<b>Scott</b>	Huh?
Faye	Is that making you feel worse, me having that out?
<b>Scott</b>	Who else-- look at that. Look at that.
Faye	You think it might be going somewhere, Scott?
<b>Scott</b>	Well, you tell me. Where does it go? Where does it go? What does that cable go?
Faye	So that's for the electricity. So it plugs into the wall. What do you think happens to it?
<b>Scott</b>	They have surveillance. I've seen it. I've seen it on TV. In England, you can't go anywhere, but there's a camera on you. Everywhere you walk down the street, you go around the corner, you go in a shop, you come out, there's a camera on you. CCTV. They call it CCTV. It's everywhere. They see everything you do, everywhere you go, everyone you talk to. Well, it's starting here. It's starting here. You got down George Street, they got cameras outside the cinema. They say ah, law and order, law and order. Bullshit. They're watching us. They're watching us. It's surveillance.
Faye	OK. Who's watching, Scott?
<b>Scott</b>	I don't know whose watching. Asio or something.
Faye	Asio.
<b>Scott</b>	I don't know who they are. Fucking coppers. Someone, I reckon.
Faye	OK.
<b>Scott</b>	I got better things to do than fucking--
Faye	You remember before, Scott? When you used to feel like this before?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, yeah, yeah.
Faye	And you used to think that people were watching you on CCTV?
<b>Scott</b>	They are!

Faye	Yep. I believe that you believe they're watching you, OK?
<b>Scott</b>	They're watching you, too. They're watching all of us.
Faye	But look at you.
[SCOTT SIGHS]	
Faye	It's stressing you out.
<b>Scott</b>	I'm all right. I'm all right.
Faye	What's your mood been like? Tell me about your mood recently.
<b>Scott</b>	It's all right.
Faye	Yeah? You've always described your mood around eight or nine out of 10.
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, well.
Faye	Same?
<b>Scott</b>	Same, same. It's good. It's good mood. Good mood. Always good.
Faye	Yeah. And you always enjoyed watching TV?
<b>Scott</b>	Nah. I don't watch TV. I don't watch TV. I kicked the fucking thing in.
Faye	You smashed it in?
<b>Scott</b>	I kicked it, I didn't fucking smash it.
Faye	What was going on with the TV, Scott?
[SCOTT SCOFFS]	
<b>Scott</b>	Same deal. Fucking--
Faye	Coming at you?
<b>Scott</b>	Just while I'm trying to watch a fucking TV show and it fucking--
[BUZZING SOUND]	--fucking kicked the fucking thing. Kicked the shit out of it. Fuck it.
Faye	Is it the signals again coming into your brain?
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, yeah, yeah. Fucking won't leave you alone.
Faye	What about the radio?
<b>Scott</b>	Nah, nah. Not so bad.
Faye	Billboards?
<b>Scott</b>	Nah. Fucking billboards. I'm just walking down the street, I'm looking like that. I'm not looking up there, all right? I'm not looking up there. They can see me, but that doesn't mean I have to see them. I don't have to look at them, all right?

Faye	OK.
[SCOTT SIGHS]	
<b>Scott</b>	Can I go? I want to go. I want to go. I've had me needle, I've done the right thing.
Faye	You have, you have. You've always come for your treatment. I appreciate that. We've got a good relationship going on. You're honest with me, I'm honest with you, OK? I think you're unwell at the minute.
<b>Scott</b>	I don't like that. I don't like that. I wish you'd shut it. I wish you'd shut it. Just shut it. Thank you, thank you. That's not hard, is it? I mean, it's not a lot to ask, is it?
Faye	I'm sorry about that, Scott. I just wanted to reference to your discharge summary. Scott, I think you're unwell.
[SCOTT SCOFFS]	
<b>Scott</b>	Fuck.
Faye	I think you need a review by our doctor. You know him very well, he knows you.
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah.
Faye	Yeah? You've been through this before. I think all he needs to do is just adjust your medication.
<b>Scott</b>	No! I've been taking this shit for thirty fucking years!
Faye	Scott--
<b>Scott</b>	30 years. And all you ever want to do-- no one ever says about decreasing it, no one ever says, "You're going well, we'll decrease your medication, it's all all right." Come in here, see the doctor, have some more pills, have another jab. That's what I get. That's what I've been getting for 30 fucking years!
Faye	Calm down, Scott. I said adjust your medication, OK? We know you're not right. You don't like feeling like this. OK?
[SCOTT SIGHS]	
<b>Scott</b>	Yeah, alright.
Faye	We'll see him today, I'll get you in.
<b>Scott</b>	OK, alright.
Faye	Alright. Go and get a coffee, come back and we'll see the doc. Alright?

Faye	OK, Scott. OK.
